Kjeld Deichmann, a graduate of philosophy from the University of Copenhagen studied art first in Denmark, then in Paris, Toulouse, Munich, Vienna and Florence; however, he did not start making pottery until 1934, when he and his wife Erica built their kiln on the Kingston Peninsula (they have since moved to Sussex). Never-ending experimentation and progressive skill, together with a deep artistic sense, has made their work continually vital and exciting. The basic ingredients of their pottery are stoneware and porcelain clays, various feldspathic rocks, quartz sands and Nepheline Syenite in the bodies, and a wide range of purified minerals in the glazes. Firing was formerly done by wood, then oil, and is now done by propane gas.

Their work has won many prizes, and has been exhibited at the Paris Exhibition (1937), The N.Y. World's Fair (1939), in Brazil, England, Syracuse, N.Y., Rockefeller Center, N.Y., the Newark Museum, the Corcoran Gallery and the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C., in Lausanne, Switzerland, and at the Brussels World's Fair. In 1955, a twenty year's retrospective exhibition was held at the N.B. Museum in Saint John, N.B.

Among institutions having permanent collections of the Deichmanns' work are the Royal Ontario Museum, the N.B. Museum, the Montreal Art Gallery, and the Newark Museum, and it is in many fine private collections.

In 1960-61, Kjeld Deichmann received a Canada Council Senior Award which enabled the two to travel in Europe for ten months of study and observation.

"Working as we do with the elements of the ancients—Earth, Water, Fire and Air, the possibilities for creative and technical experimentation are infinite."

Earth: *The endless combinations of clays and minerals for the bodies and the glazes.*

Water: *The kinds of water used in mixing, suspending and binding the bodies and the glazes.*

Fire: *The pattern of the rising temperatures needed for maturing of the bodies and the glazes through vitrification.*

Air: *The oxydizing, reducing and alternating atmospheres in the kiln during the process of firing the bodies and the glazes.*

Our approach to our work is an attempt to capture and express the abstract in line, colour, texture and shape."
