COURT-MARTIAL IS CONTINUING

Inquire Into Alleged Negligence of Two R.C. A.M.C. Men

Toronto, April 15.—(CP)—Capt. W. A. Stilwell, defending officer for Capt. William Nathan Winkler, R.C.A.M.C., who is charged jointly with army doctor Capt. John William Jackson with negligence in the death of a private, gave notice to the general court-martial at Fort York armouries here yesterday that he intended to make a motion of dismissal of the charges.

He said the dismissal motion would be based on the grounds that the charges, arising from the death of Pte. J. H. Sommerville, of New York city, in Stanley barracks last January, had not been proved.
